Dear Friend,

The Advisory Board of The Carl B. Kern Fund is very pleased to present to you our first **Annual Report**, detailing the Fund's progress and gratefully acknowledging its supporters.

The Fund's distribution for 1989 will be \$201. A check in this amount from The Dayton Foundation will be presented to YMCA Camp Kern in June, anticipating that it will be used this year to provide financial assistance for a needy youth who would otherwise be unable to attend summer camp.

Because of the generous contributions of many individuals, the total amount of gifts in The Carl B. Kern Fund more than doubled during 1988, from \$2600 to \$5565. With additional contributions already received in 1989, the total currently stands at \$6545. The actual principal in the Fund will be slightly higher, due to recent revisions in The Dayton Foundation's investment policy which states that a portion of the interest a Fund earns will now be returned to that Fund to keep the principal amount in pace with inflation. This will result in somewhat smaller distributions in the near future, but over the long run both the principal and the distributions will increase substantially. The Advisory Board's goal for 1989 is to bring the total amount of gifts to \$10,000 by year's end.



"Carl B. Kern sought no greater honor than to be accounted worthy the friendship of the hundreds of young fellows who were under his personal care and attention in the boys' department of the Y. M. C. A.

"Carl Kern built wisely in Dayton. The things he started here with the boys will go on and the policies he followed will be held worthy of emulation by those who follow him.

"Camp Ozone, at Ft. Ancient, where hundreds of these full-of-life young chaps were accustomed to spend their vacation days, will stand as a permanent memorial to the aggressive activities

of Mr. Kern. Many important innovations in the boys' department of the Y. M. C. A. bear testimony of his efficiency and potential interest in the service.

"Any men whose work is among young men and wide-awake boys bears a tremendous responsibility, and the reward for a successful service is great.

"And so today the boys of the Y. M. C. A. are grieving because one of their number has gone away. It will be a rather difficult task to fill the vacancy that Carl Kern's death has created. His loss is a personal one in hundreds of Dayton homes."—Editorial, Dayton Daily News, June 4, 1917.
