Dear Friend,

On this, the 110th birthday of C.B. Kern, I'm proud to present to you our second **Annual Report**, reviewing the activities of The Carl B. Kern Fund during 1989.

Last summer, I had the privilege of presenting a check in the amount of \$201 to Camp Kern Board Chairman Bill Pees at the annual "Strawberries 'n' Ice Cream" Dinner held at camp on June 14. The check was passed on to Executive Director Larry Maxwell who, in accordance with the purpose of the Fund, used the money to help subsidize the camp fee for a teen-age youth, allowing him to participate in an out-trip to Minnesota.

The 1990 Fund distribution is expected to be \$400. A check in this amount from The Dayton Foundation will be presented to Camp Kern again this summer, anticipating that the distribution will be used as it was last year - providing financial assistance for needy youths who would otherwise be unable to attend summer camp.

Thirty-nine (39) donations totaling \$7,345 were received during 1989, more than doubling the grand total of gifts towards The Carl B. Kern Fund - from \$5,565 to \$12,910. With additional gifts already received in 1990, that total has reached \$13,035. The actual principal in the Fund is slightly higher due to The Dayton Foundation's current investment policy which allows for a portion of the interest a fund earns to be returned to that fund to keep the principal in pace with inflation. The Advisory Board's goal for 1990 is to bring the grand total of gifts to \$20,000 by year's end.

All of us on the Carl B. Kern Fund Advisory Board want to take this opportunity to again thank you who have supported the Fund for your generosity. Please do not hesitate to contact me or other members of the Advisory Board if you have any questions or need additional information.
