Dear Friend,

It is once again a pleasure to mark the birthday of C.B. Kern with a report on the activities of The Carl B. Kern Fund during 1991.

A \$700 distribution check was presented on June 12, 1991 to Larry Maxwell, Camp Kern's Executive Director, at the annual camp "Strawberries 'n' Ice Cream" Dinner. The amount was used during the summer to subsidize expenses and assist with stipends for several 17-year-old youths participating in the Leadership-in-Training / Counselor-in-Training Program.


This summer's distribution check should be more than double last year's amount - at least \$1,600. In view of last year's shortage of campership funds and an anticipated increased demand for camperships this summer, it is expected that the entire amount will be made available to those youths requiring financial assistance to attend a session of summer camp.

A record high forty-six (46) gifts totaling \$5,990 were received from forty (40) donors during 1991, increasing the grand total of gifts to The Carl B. Kern Fund from \$18,920 to \$24,910. Additional gifts this year have pushed the grand total past \$25,000, and with accrued interest added in, the market value of the Fund is now close to \$28,000.

It has been nearly five years since the Fund's inception in November of 1987. Its goals remains steadfast - to recognize and promote the positive impact organized camping can have on youth, to provide financial support which will help perpetuate the camping experience for generations to come, and to honor the man who not only had the foresight to develop youth camping in the Dayton area but whose character and leadership skills continue to serve as an example to us all.

On behalf of the entire Kern Fund Advisory Board, I want to express my deepest gratitude for the generosity of the seventy donors who have built the Fund to its current value. Having exceeded the \$25,000 mark, the Fund now qualifies as a Permanent Fund which will be maintained by The Dayton Foundation in perpetuity. This is an accomplishment in which we can all take great pride. Thanks so much for your support.

"Carl B. Kern sought no greater honor than to be accounted worthy the friendship of the hundreds of young fellows who were under his personal care and attention in the boys' department of the Y.M.C.A.

"Carl B. Kern built wisely in Dayton. The things he started here with the boys will go on and the policies he followed will be held worthy of emulation by those who follow him.

"Camp Ozone, at Ft. Ancient, where hundreds of these full-of-life young chaps were accustomed to spend their vacation days, will stand as a permanent memorial to the aggressive activities of Mr. Kern. Many important innovations in the boys' department of the Y.M.C.A. bear testimony of his efficiency and potential interest in the service.

"Any men whose work is among young men and wide-awake boys bears a tremendous responsibility, and the reward for a successful service is great.

"And so today the boys of the Y.M.C.A. are grieving because one of their number has gone away. It will be a rather difficult task to fill the vacancy that Carl Kern's death has created. His loss is a personal one in hundreds of Dayton homes."
